Showcasing Solution Focused Courts in Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand

On 20 and 21 February 2026, the *Bugmy* Bar Book, NSW Bar Association, Te Kura Kaiwhakawā (New Zealand Institute of Judicial Studies) and the University of Technology, Sydney, will be hosting Solution Focused Justice: A Cross Jurisdictional Symposium with the support of the NSW Judicial Commission and Australasian Institute of Judicial Administration.

The symposium will be an opportunity to showcase the way in which solution focused courts and effective and responsive approaches to justice are operating in Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand, to share experiences, identify examples of best practice and create ongoing connections between members

of the legal profession and the judiciary who are involved in delivering justice in therapeutic courts. The *Bugmy* Bar Book is developing a webpage which will post content to inform and inspire members of the judiciary, lawyers, service providers and others who are working within solution focused courts or mainstream courts considering adopting solution focused elements into their courts and practice.

We are asking organisations providing support and services in solution focused courts or lists in Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand to prepare a 5-7 minute video to briefly outline their service. The videos will be posted on the *Bugmy* Bar Book website which is hosting the Solution Focused Justice: A Cross Jurisdictional Symposium webpage.

We would be very grateful if you would consider recording a video to support the Symposium.

Questions we suggest you address in the video:

- 1. Introduce yourself and your organisation and support / service.
- 2. What does your organisation and support / service do and what are the objectives?
- 3. Describe how your organisation / service supports a solution focused court or process and the benefits you believe your service brings to the process.
- 4. Explain how your organisation / service supports people before mainstream courts.
- 5. Share how your service assists the court to be better informed, more trauma informed and more culturally safe.

Guide for recording the presentation

- The presentations should be 5-7 minutes in length. The idea of the presentations is to provide a snapshot of your organisation and support / service. If you have any other links or information which you would like to share, please email this to us along with your video presentation and we may post this on our site as well.
- We will be using the Zoom conferencing application for this presentation. Please ensure you have the latest copy of the Zoom app on your device. These can be found at https://zoom.us/download.
- If you can, please ensure that the presentations are recorded and saved in 4k resolution.
- When you record can you please reflect back the questions for example "My organisation / service has objectives that are..." and "The practices and approaches adopted are different in the following ways...".

Background

- If possible, sit in front of a background which is not cluttered – ideally a blank wall.
- Avoid sitting in front of a window, as the light behind you will be too bright.


Lighting

- Please film indoors. It is best to light yourself from the front with two light sources, one at 45 degrees to the right side of your face / body and one at 45 degrees to the left.
- Try to avoid having any obvious light sources behind you, including other lights or a window, as this causes your face to be dark and /or haloed.

Audio

- If possible, please use a phone earpiece/microphone connected to the filming device via a long cable.
- If you have to, use the onboard microphone of a laptop or other device,
- Please make sure that the area where you film is quiet.
